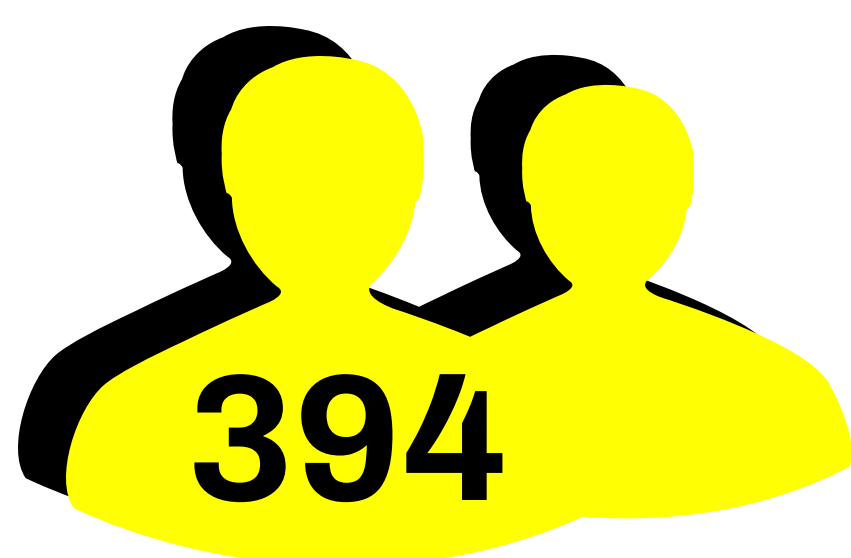
## Phase 1

Below is a list of the contributions towards the 'Unite: It's not as simple as black and white' programme.

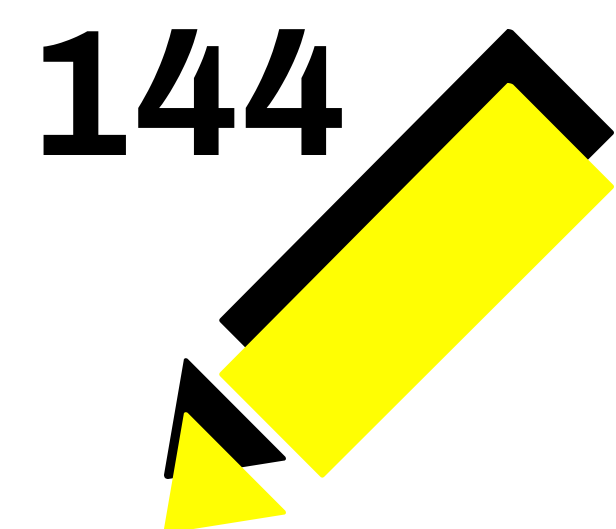

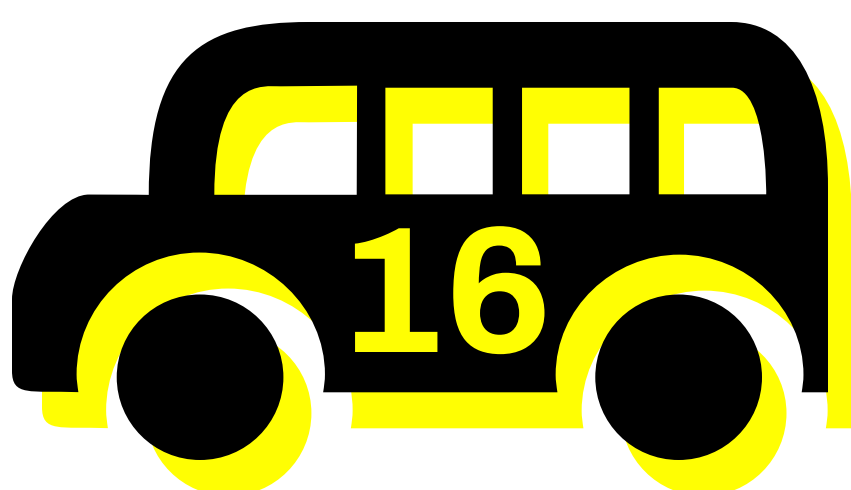

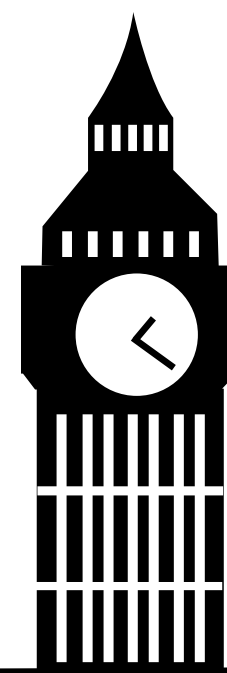

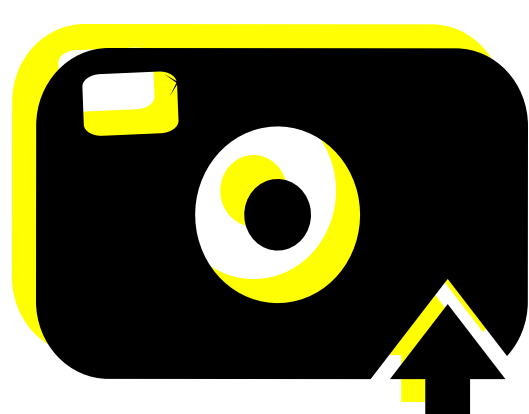

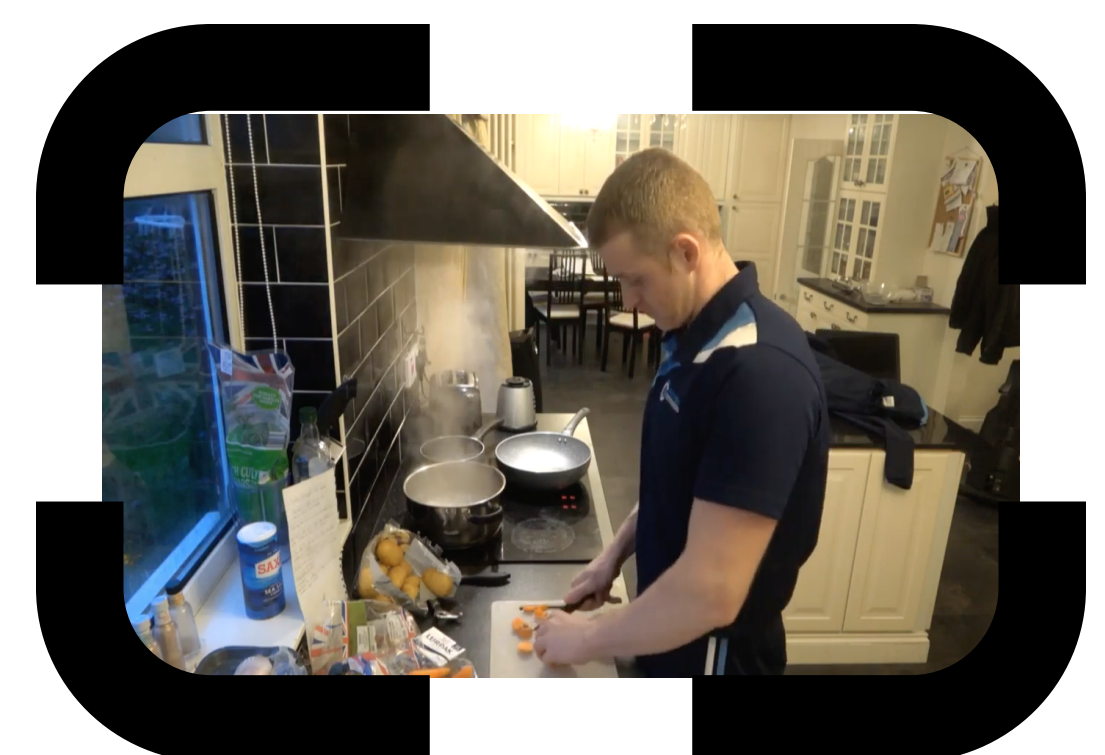

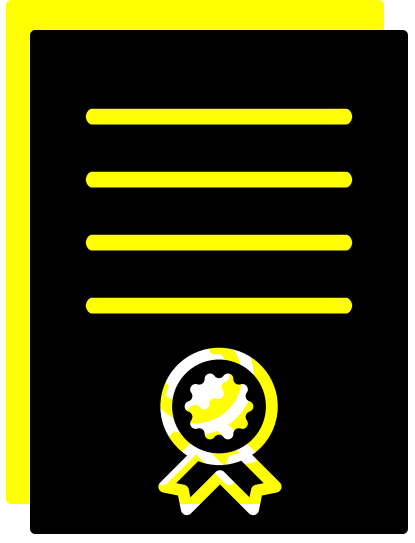
